Disciplinary Procedures for Student Drug and Alcohol Abuse

Any student of the school district found using or in possession of alcohol; controlled substances; drug paraphernalia (as defined by local, state and federal statutes); inhalants; copycat or synthetic drugs or alcohol; look-alike drugs or alcohol (substances that are represented as a drugs or alcohol regardless of the true nature of the substance); and any substance intended to be used for mind-altering effects on school property or at a school-related activity may be subject to the following:

First Violation:

1. Three to five day suspension
2. Parent/guardian notification of suspension and reinstatement conference
3. Police notification
4. Referral to Student Assistance Program or Student Services Staff for screening/counseling
5. Possible recommendation to the Board for expulsion.
6. If expulsion is not recommended, recommendation for a pre-expulsion contract in lieu of expulsion.

Second Violation (Significant Violation of Pre-Expulsion Contract):

1. Ten day suspension, with up to fifteen day suspension, pending expulsion hearing
2. Parent/guardian notification of suspension and pending expulsion hearing
3. Police notification
4. Recommendation to the Board for expulsion

Exchange, Distribution, Sale or Giving Away of Alcohol or Controlled Substances:

Any student of the school District found to be exchanging, distributing, selling or giving away alcohol; controlled substances; drug paraphernalia (as defined by local, state and federal statutes); inhalants; copycat or synthetic drugs or alcohol; look-alike drugs or alcohol (substances that are represented as a drugs or alcohol regardless of the true nature of the substance); and any substance intended to be used for mind-altering effects, in the school building, on school property, or at any school-related activity (whether participating in or attending) will be subject to the following:

1. Ten day suspension, with up to 15 day suspension, pending expulsion hearing
2. Parent/guardian notification of suspension and pending expulsion hearing
3. Police notification
4. Recommendation to the Board for expulsion

All cases will be handled on an individual basis using any or all of the above consequences.
