Drug Paraphernalia

No student may use, possess with the sole intent to use, deliver, possess with intent to deliver or manufacture drug paraphernalia on school premises.

“Drug paraphernalia” means all equipment, products and materials of any kind that are used or solely intended for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance.

“Drug paraphernalia” includes, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- A. Kits used or solely intended for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing or harvesting of any species of plant that is a controlled substance or from which a controlled substance can be derived.
- B. Kits used or solely intended for use in manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing or preparing controlled substances.
- C. Isomerization devices (devices used to change drugs into a different form) used or solely intended for use in increasing the potency of any species of plant that is a controlled substance.
- D. Testing equipment used or solely intended for use in identifying, or in analyzing the strength, effectiveness or purity of controlled substances.
- E. Scales and balances used or solely intended for use in weighing or measuring controlled substances.
- F. Diluents and adulterants, such as quinine hydrochloride, mannitol, mannite, dextrose and lactose, used or solely intended for use in cutting controlled substances.
- G. Separation gins and sifters used or solely intended for use in removing twigs and seeds from, or in otherwise cleaning or refining, marijuana.
- H. Blenders, bowls, containers, spoons and mixing devices used or solely intended for use in compounding controlled substances.
- I. Capsules, balloons, envelopes and other containers used or solely intended for use in packaging small quantities of controlled substance.
- J. Containers and other objects used or solely intended for use in storing or concealing controlled substances.
- K. Objects used or solely intended for use in ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing marijuana, cocaine, hashish or hashish oil into the human body, such as:
 - a. Metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic or ceramic pipes with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads or punctured metal bowls
 - b. Water pipes
 - c. Carburetion tubes and devices
 - d. Smoking and carburetion masks
 - e. Roach clips: meaning objects used to hold burning material, such as a marijuana cigarette, that has become too small or too short to be held in the hand

- f. Miniature cocaine spoons and cocaine vials.
- g. Chamber pipes
- h. Carburetor pipes
- i. Electric pipes
- j. Air-driven pipes
- k. Chilams
- l. Bongs
- m. Ice pipes or chillers

Any student found violating this policy shall be subject to Disciplinary Procedure for Student Drug and Alcohol Abuse (Section 5314.1) including confiscation of illegal drug paraphernalia which will be turned over to the police.

An exemption to this policy may be allowed for the use or possession of such a device if the Board of Education's designee (building Principal or Superintendent) determines that the device is to be used for or is possessed for medical, educational, vocational, or other legitimate use and permission is granted by the designee in writing.
