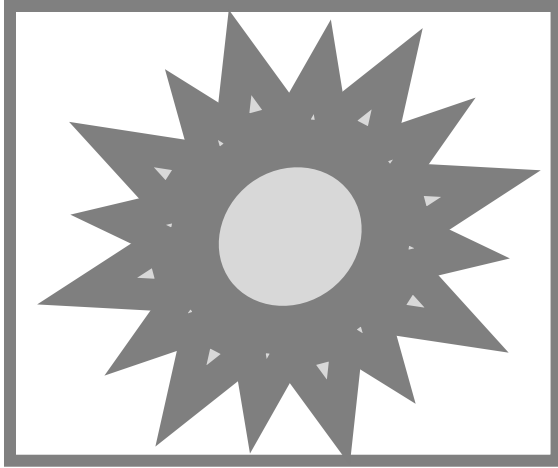

REGULATIONS

Registration:

Scheduling for Elementary summer courses will open April 6, 2017 using Skyward Family Access at home or at Schurz School from 4:00PM – 6:30PM. Online scheduling will remain open through May 10, 2017. Courses will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Please schedule your child early to ensure placement in your desired class.

All courses (including make-up courses) have a maximum number of students per class. Once this number has been reached, enrollment will be denied. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

Any families requiring that student information be mailed to two places of residence should contact the Summer School office at **920-262-1465**. After June 19, please call 262-7500 for grade 1-12 students and 262-1465 for PreK/Kindergarten students.

All course fees, waivers and bussing information must be received by the Summer School office at Lincoln School within two weeks of online scheduling, or your child may be dropped from summer school. Items can be mailed to Lincoln School, 210 N Montgomery Street or dropped off in person between 7:30am and 4:00pm. Lincoln School is the only location where summer school paperwork will be accepted.

Attendance

Absences:

If your child is going to be absent, for any reason, it is very important that you report the absence. If your child is attending Summer School at Watertown High School, call 262-7500. If your child is attending Summer School at Lincoln Elementary School, call 262-1465.

Students enrolled in summer school courses are encouraged to attend all classes. Students enrolled in “make-up” courses **must** attend all classes, except for emergencies or permission of the Summer School Director. Students who are absent more than two class sessions will receive **no credit**. For **Freshman Health and Money 101**, **100% Attendance is required in order to receive .5 credit.**

Tardy Policy:

Students are required to be in their classrooms when the bell rings at the beginning of each session and at the end of all breaks. If a student is not in the room when the bell rings, they are considered tardy. A student arriving more than five minutes after the bell of any particular session will receive 1/3 absence. A student leaving early from any class session will also receive 1/3 absence. The Administrative Assistant should be contacted regarding extenuating circumstances.

Supplies:

Students are encouraged to bring general school supplies such as pencils, crayons, scissors, and glue.

Tuition:

Regardless of the school attended during the regular term, students who live in the Watertown School District may enroll tuition free. **Those living outside the Watertown School District must pay tuition unless open-enrolled in WUSD.** Interested individuals should call the Educational Service Center at 262-1460.

TRANSPORTATION

Elementary students will wait in the high school gym to be picked up each day.

May 12 is the deadline for students to sign up for any BUS transportation! Once the routes are established, it becomes very difficult for the bus company to make last minute changes. For this reason, we have established a deadline for registering students requiring transportation service. Bus transportation for rural students will be provided to special designated areas. Call Jaime Gwidt at (920)262-1485 to sign up.

May 12 is the deadline for signing up for rural and shuttle bus service.
Students registering after the deadline will need to call
Transportation Services at 261-5062 for clearance and availability.

Shuttle bus service to and from RMS, Douglas, Lincoln, Webster, and Schurz to Watertown High School and Lincoln Elementary School will be available for students in the city limits. Adult supervision is provided **on** the shuttle buses; however, it is NOT provided at the shuttle bus sites. Please make every effort to be at the sites at the end of the day to pick-up students at the appropriate time. Please contact the Summer School office at 262-7500 immediately in the event a child has not arrived home at the expected time. Pick-up points will be at Riverside, Douglas, Lincoln, Schurz and Webster Schools. Shuttle bus students MUST be at their pick-up site by 7:15 AM each day. If special transportation arrangements or a change in routine are in order for a student, parents must call the school, TSI and send a note with the student. If there is a miscommunication, the student will be taken to the high school.

Students are responsible for demonstrating safe, appropriate behavior while riding the bus. Expectations and consequences will be consistent with those required during the course of the regular school year.

Bus Rules:

Previous to Loading, on the road and at school:

1. Students should be on time at the designated loading zone (5 minutes prior to scheduled stop).
2. Students should stay off the road at all times while walking to, or waiting for the bus. They should line up single file on the sidewalk off the roadway.
3. Students should wait until the bus is completely stopped before moving forward to enter. If a student must cross a highway, he/she should not cross until the bus driver signals that it is safe.
4. Students should enter the bus single file and go immediately to a seat and be seated.
5. If a student is going to be absent, his/her parents/guardian should inform the family of the student who is picked up one bus stop before, or call the bus company, so they can relay a message to the driver.

Use of Video Camera on the School Bus: The Watertown Unified School District approves the use of video cameras on the school buses for the primary purpose of reducing disciplinary problems and vandalism on the bus, thereby allowing the driver to focus on the driving of the bus, providing for safer transportation for our students. In addition, video cameras are utilized in viewing the Watertown High School Parking Lot for the primary purpose of reducing disciplinary problems and vandalism.

Bicycle racks are available at the main entrance of each school. Bike locks are required. The Watertown Unified School District is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen bicycles.

Appropriate dress is expected during summer school. Tennis shoes or sandals with backs are recommended. NO FLIP-FLOPS PLEASE!

LUNCH TIME!

Pre-Kindergarten & Kindergarten: Due to the school day ending at 11:30 AM, school lunch will not be available. Juice and a snack are offered during morning break at no cost to the students.

Grades 1 through 12: School lunch will be available to students in Grades 1- 12. Any student who does not have afternoon classes, but would like to stay for lunch may do so provided they have transportation and they adhere to all rules and regulations. **All children 18 years and under are eligible to receive FREE meals. An adult lunch is \$3.50. Please bring exact change or check written to WUSD if you are having an adult lunch.**

A FORM MUST BE FILLED OUT FOR LUNCH. A menu for the 20 days is located at the end of this booklet.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN IS INTENDED FOR CHILDREN WHO WILL BE ENTERING KINDERGARTEN IN FALL 2017.

If your child is going to be absent, please call the school office at 262-1465.

This program is for all children who are five years of age on or before September 1 and are entering kindergarten in the fall of 2017. Children must also reside within the boundaries of the Watertown Unified School District.

The classes will be held at **Lincoln Elementary School: 210 N. Montgomery St.**

Please register early, as the classes do fill quickly.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF STUDENTS PER CLASS: 20

This class meets from 8:10 to 11:30 a.m.

The purpose of this program is to help your child get ready for kindergarten. The curriculum for this program will focus on:

1. Learning readiness skills.
2. Social interaction skill development related to building new adult and peer friendships.
3. Learning social skills of how to share and take turns.
4. Acquisition of listening and following directions skills.
5. The development of language skills through a variety of language experiences.
6. Hands-on exploration of various types of art media.
7. The development of physical and coordination skills through games of low organization.
8. Music activities related to group singing and rhythms.

BUS STUDENTS: IMPORTANT! A name tag will be provided for all Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten children riding rural and shuttle buses. These tags will include their name, school destination, address, home phone number, and bus route number or shuttle site. The tags MUST be worn for all 20 days of Summer School.

Rural bus transportation and the city shuttle bus service will be provided only before school and at 11:30 a.m.

Please have children dressed appropriately for the weather. Children should wear tennis shoes or sandals with backs. NO FLIP-FLOPS PLEASE!

KINDERGARTEN LEVEL COURSES ARE INTENDED FOR CHILDREN ENTERING FIRST GRADE IN FALL 2017

All kindergartners will be scheduled for classes at **Lincoln Elementary School** – 210 N. Montgomery St.
Please schedule early, as the classes do fill quickly.

All Kindergarten courses will be held in two sessions:
Session I 8:10-9:30 a.m. Session II 9:50-11:30 a.m.

If your child is going to be absent, please call the school office at 262-1465.

BUS STUDENTS: IMPORTANT! A name tag will be provided for all Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten children riding rural and shuttle buses. These tags will include their name, school destination, address, home phone number and bus route number or shuttle site. The tags MUST be worn for all 20 days of Summer School. Rural bus transportation and the city shuttle bus service will be provided before school and at 11:30 a.m. There will be no bus transportation at 9:40 a.m.

Fundamentals for First Grade Reading

This class is designed to maintain/improve students beginning reading skills. Goals include working on letter names, letter sounds, formation of letters and beginning sight words. Students will be involved in whole group, small group/partner and individual reading based on their end of year reading level.
**Enrollment requires the kindergarten teacher's recommendation.*

Fundamentals for First Grade Math

This class is manipulative/game based and designed to increase students understanding of math concepts and skills that are needed to be successful in first grade. Need will be based on the end of the year Kindergarten math assessments.
**Enrollment requires the kindergarten teacher's recommendation.*

Looking Ahead to Grade 1

Curious about first grade curriculum? Then participate in this all-around program designed to prepare students for their first grade experience. Activities include: teaching and/or strengthening skills related to reading, writing, phonics and math. During weekly themes students will journal write, listen to stories, practice reading skills and explore science through experiments.

Books are Fun!

Calling all book worms! Join us as we gain a better understanding of and appreciation for children's literature. Through exposure to different reading selections, students examine author and illustrator roles, identify different parts of a book, and increase reading for enjoyment. Activities include creating individual books, expanding and adding to existing stories, acting out stories, as well as a host of other hands-on projects.

Fun and Games

Twist and shout! It's time to shake those couch potato blues! This class provides students with a variety of team and individual games, art activities, and books. Students learn good sportsmanship and positive self-esteem, as well as learning that physical activity is fun and good for you. Emphasis is placed on developing fine and gross motor skills, cooperation and having fun!

Discovery Zone

Come discover how to make ice cream, dinosaur fossils, moon sand, goop, butter, volcanoes, and scratch art. Learn how to color pasta, make your own bubbles and many more fun, hands-on activities!

Wiggles, Squiggles, & Giggles

Children will be making wonderful art projects with a twist! They'll learn new versions of familiar songs and plays, and make "props" to go along with them such as finger puppets or masks. You will be asked to furnish various items such as paper towel tubes, material scraps, cardboard egg cartons, etc.

ENRICHMENT CLASSES

Mega-bytes of Fun! 3-4

This course is designed to satisfy every child's appetite for computer fun. Students explore the latest in exciting interactive software on PC computers.

Arts and Crafts 1-2

Exercise your creativity and help save the environment at the same time! Projects can be completed in one or two class periods. We will use many household items that are recycled from home such as jars, paper towel tubes, styro-foam trays, lids, etc., making this class fun and environmentally sound! Skills typical of first and second graders, such as cutting, pasting, coloring, painting and basic construction techniques will be used. Parents must provide most of the supplies for their child.

Arts and Crafts 3-4

Here's your chance to use various artistic mediums. These projects are made from recyclable materials or household objects, which allows you to recreate these items at home. A wide variety of types of projects are covered, so there is something for everyone. Bring your creativity and see that your art is not right or wrong, good or bad, but it is just unique!

Drama and Acting 1-4

Students will have the opportunity to perform in a musical where they will sing, dance, and act on the big stage for a live audience. A performance will be held on Tuesday, July 18th during their class period as well as that evening. Time is TBA. **Parents:** Please make sure your schedule allows your child to be at both of these performances.

Great Gardening 1-4

Get ready to start your planting. Students will learn all about the art of gardening!

Let the Games Begin 1-2 OR 3-4

This course is an alternative to physical education games. Don't you love to play Board Games? This course is a survey of classic board games, including chess and other games of strategy!

Rising Stars 1-2 OR 3-4

Creative Movements/Yoga 2-4

Students will engage in meaningful fun movement activities, using music and stories. The class will explore basic yoga movements that will increase strength, flexibility and balance. They will also explore breathing and mindfulness techniques to reduce stress and develop attention and concentration.

Scrapbooking 1-2 OR 3-4

Project Fee: \$10.00

Snack Time! 1-4

Project Fee: \$10.00

In this class, students will have an opportunity to learn about healthy living by participating in a brief exercise period and by learning about the food pyramid and all five food groups. They will also make healthy snacks that incorporate ingredients from the various food groups.

GRADES 1-4

Stamping/Paper Crafting 2-4

Project Fee: \$10.00

Make greeting cards and fun gift ideas with rubber stamps. Each week you'll take home great crafts and cards to give to your friends and family.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Spanish 1-4

Learn about the customs and traditions of Spanish speaking people through the study of basic Spanish. The alphabet, colors, days of the week, month, numbers from 1-100 and basic phrases are just a sample of some of the units taught. Some activities include singing Spanish songs and learning Mexican dances. Games such as Bingo, Around the World, Twenty Questions, and Memory are played to learn Spanish words. These activities will help you develop an interest of the Spanish language and a desire to learn more.

Dual Language 1-3

SCHURZ DUAL LANGUAGE STUDENTS ONLY

This course is solely intended for students attending Schurz Elementary School that are currently enrolled in the Dual Language program in first through third grade. Continued language development will be emphasized.

MATHEMATICS

Math Grade 1

This course is designed for students needing extra help with their math skills. This course reviews and reinforces basic math skills taught/learned during the regular school year.

Math Grade 2

This course is designed for students needing extra help with their math skills. This course reviews and reinforces basic math skills taught/learned during the regular school year.

Math 3

This course is designed for students needing extra help with their math skills. This course reviews and reinforces basic math skills taught/learned during the regular school year.

Math 4

This course is designed for students needing extra help with their math skills. This course reviews and reinforces basic math skills taught/learned during the regular school year.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Balls... Balls... Balls 1-4

If you like to play basketball, dodge ball, and survivor this class is for you. This class is designed to get the most fun out of your summer, while practicing teamwork and good sportsmanship. **Gym shoes required.**

Wrestling 1-4

Students will learn the fundamentals of wrestling. This instructional course is offered for students of any ability level

Bowling 1-4

Fee: \$65.00 and Waiver

Students will learn bowling techniques and scoring. Students will be transported to Watertown Bowl 18 for bowling practice!

Games Galore 3-4

Games Galore will consist of exciting lifetime games that include ultimate Frisbee, Passball, Team Handball, and Softball/Floor Hockey. They will be broken down into 4 day units with a game day to follow the end of each unit. A baseball/softball glove will be needed. Come prepared to have fun!!

Gymnastics 1-4: Waiver

Students will be taught many aspects of a gymnastics program. This instructional course is offered for students of any ability level.

Biking the Town Grades 3 & 4: Waiver

Students taking this class will learn basic bicycle maintenance, safety, and practical riding skills via classroom discussion and on-the-road practice. They will also gain the knowledge needed to make informed decisions while riding in traffic. Get ready to HAVE FUN while applying your newfound skills on group rides around "The Town." **PLEASE BE SURE that you have a helmet and that your bike is in working order.**

Soccer 3-4: Waiver

This course is designed to give students a basic understanding of the game of soccer through games and other activities. Basic skills, learning the rules and having fun will be emphasized.

Tennis 1-2 and 3-4: Waiver

TRY Tennis...LOVE Tennis... Calling all students interested in Tennis! This is an opportunity to learn the basics, or tune up your current skills. You may bring your own racket or one will be supplied for you. Instruction will be given regardless of your level with opportunities to play other students at similar skill levels. This is your big chance to enjoy the game that is sweeping Watertown!

GRADES 1-4

Walk and Talk 1-4: Waiver

A delightful way to get low impact exercise while you walk and talk with your friends...and maybe make some new ones! Wear walking shoes – NO heels or sandals.

Wild World of Sports 1-2

Engage in physical activities while developing a positive self-image and an ability to interact well with others. Several different games are played each day. Relay races, tumbling, mat ball, hula hoops, jump ropes, and tag games are just a sampling of the wide variety of games offered.

READING

Book Club 3-4 This is not a remedial class.

Students going into fourth and fifth grade explore books through silent reading, partner reading and literature class. Poetry, fiction, nonfiction, mysteries, plays, folktales, etc. are used to create a positive relationship with literature.

Book Worms 1-2 This is not a remedial class.

This course provides enrichment activities such as plays, puppet shows, thematic units, and an author study to help students see reading just for fun is an excellent thing to do! Students gain confidence in oral reading and storytelling; identify main idea, character, and author; and define good characters, evil characters and magical events of folk/fairy tales.

Calling All Authors 3-4

This is not a remedial class.

Students will learn the fun of creative writing. They will be guided into excellence in the written language. This course is for students who enjoy writing and want to have fun with it!

I Can Read - Grade 1

Students needing extra support with their reading skills are encouraged to enroll. The class emphasizes individual and small group reading, decoding skills (phonics), building sight vocabulary, and writing.

Guided Reading - Grade 1

This class is limited to 8 students. Students scheduled in this class would have received recommendation from their teachers. The class emphasizes individual and small group reading, decoding skills (phonics), building sight vocabulary, and writing.

I Can Read - Grade 2

Students needing extra support with their reading skills are encouraged to enroll. The class emphasizes individual and small group reading,

decoding skills (phonics), building sight vocabulary, and writing.

Guided Reading - Grade 2

This class is limited to 8 students. Students scheduled in this class would have received recommendation from their teachers. The class emphasizes individual and small group reading, decoding skills (phonics), building sight vocabulary, and writing.

I Can Read Grade 3

Students needing extra support with their reading skills are encouraged to enroll. The class emphasizes individual and small group reading, decoding skills (phonics), building sight vocabulary, and writing.

I Can Read - Grade 4

Students needing extra support with their reading skills are encouraged to enroll. The class emphasizes individual and small group reading, decoding skills (phonics), building sight vocabulary, and writing.

I Can Write 1-2

This is a remedial class intended for students who need help learning to write. Any students challenged by writing are encouraged to enroll. Students will improve in both reading and writing by participating in fun and creative writing activities. Additionally, **students who are invited by certified reading staff to participate in Early Reading Empowerment (ERE) are required to schedule this class.**

GRADES 1-4

SCIENCE

Dino Dig 1-2 OR 3-4

What was the earth like millions of year ago? We know that dinosaurs roamed the earth. Study the different kinds of dinosaurs and their habitats!

Mad Scientists 1-2

Be a part of enriching, experimental science activities. Experience science through hands on activities such as craft projects, demonstrations, worksheets, and outdoor activities.

Oceanography 3-4

Come explore the depths of the ocean in Oceanography. In this course you will dive into learning by exploring the many animals, plants, habitats, and structure of our great bodies of water. Through the creative use of dioramas, painting, and other kinesthetic activities you too can become a great explorer of our oceans.

Rainforest 1-4

Come and learn more about the endangered rainforests of the world. Students will study the animals and plants of these regions and learn what each one of us can do to help save the rainforest!

Rockets & Motion 3-4

Project Fee: \$15.00

Have a blast as you develop the hobby of rocket-building! Construct your very own model rocket. Learn how real rockets get off the ground and prepare to launch your rocket high in the sky!

Science Rocks 2-4

Come and join us in an exciting hands-on science adventure exploring electricity, magnets, sound, water, forces and motion. Each day you will learn more about science through fun science experiments and have a blast in the process! We welcome all students in grades 2-4 to come and see how science rocks!

Amazing Animals 1-2

Students explore the world of animals. They learn about animals in the wild, such as birds, amphibians, reptiles, and mammals, as well as farm animals. Also covered are the diet, habitat and their young, as well as interesting facts about each animal. New curriculum is implemented every other year on a rotating basis.

Origami-Mania 3-4

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

English (ELA) 6, 7 or 8

These courses cover independent reading, guided reading, reader's response, writing process, and [Step up to Writing](#). Students who failed, or wish to have some reading enrichment may take this class.

Reading Gr. 5 (Remedial)

You may bring your own racket or one will be supplied for you. Please wear tennis shoes and socks, along with comfortable clothing to participate. Instruction will be given regardless of your level with opportunities to play other students at similar skill levels. This is your big chance to enjoy the game that is sweeping Watertown!

Strength and Speed – Waiver (Only Grades 6 & 7)

The Watertown High School Summer Strength and Speed Program offer students the opportunity to become better athletes through a sound workout program of both weight and speed training. Students who participate in this program will be better prepared to have success in their respective sports. The three goals of the program are:

- To give each athlete a greater chance to reach his/her potential.
- To help increase each athlete's self-confidence and self-esteem.
- To offer an opportunity for athletes to compete and work hard every day they attend a workout session.

Each session will be divided equally between strength training and speed/agility work. Emphasis will be placed on improving overall body strength, speed, agility and flexibility.

Soccer 1 - Waiver

This course will give students an introduction to the game of soccer, develop basic skills and equip

students with an understanding of the rules. This class is for beginners, those new to the game or learning to play small-sided games. While some competition will be introduced, the goal is to have fun and enjoy the game having less than 2 years experience. The emphasis is on having fun and developing fundamental skills.

Soccer 2 - Waiver

This course is intended to enrich students understanding and appreciation for the game of soccer. Students will develop their fundamental skills and knowledge of the game through soccer activities.

Biking the Town - Waiver

Students taking this class will learn basic bicycle maintenance, safety, and practical riding skills via classroom discussion and on-the-road practice. They will also gain the knowledge needed to make informed decisions while riding in traffic. Get ready to HAVE FUN while applying your newfound skills on group rides around "the Town." **PLEASE BE SURE that you have a helmet and that your bike is in working order.**

How to be a "Localvore" – Waiver (Gr 6-8)

What is a "localvore"? Knowing where our food comes from is one way young adults can make healthier choices for better nutrition and reduce our carbon footprint. Plan on spending much time outdoors for this class. Students will explore the pros and cons of locally grown sustainable food systems. GRADES 9-12 COURSE OFFERINGS

ATTENTION: Your cooperation in registering by June 9 will be appreciated.

Courses with insufficient enrollments will be cancelled.

All courses have a maximum number of students per class.

Once this number has been reached, enrollment will be denied. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Courses preceded by * may be taken for make-up credit by students who did not receive credit during the regular school year. Students may earn promotion points for these courses. All students in these courses will receive a letter grade and report card.

One-half credit will be granted upon successful completion of the course.

ENGLISH

***American Literature (English 11)**

In this course, students will read literature/novels written by American authors from the seventeenth through the twentieth centuries. Students will learn about a wide variety of literary genres and will study the diverse cultural backgrounds of many American authors. Students will be exposed to short stories, poetry, essays, and supplemental reading materials. They should be prepared to write essays, compositions, summaries, and creative pieces.

***Composition (English 10)**

The emphasis in this course is on the writing process. Students will engage in writing, editing, and revising a variety of works.

***English 9**

This course covers short stories, short nonfiction, a career unit, a short novel and writing, speaking, and listening activities. This class may be taken as make-up credit for either semester of English 9.

***English 12**

This course is designed for students who did not receive credit for either semester of English 12 during the regular school year.

***Public Speaking/Communications**

This course is designed to help develop the skills necessary for public speaking. The oral aspect of language is explored. Students will be responsible for being active participants in speaking assignments. This class serves as make-up credit for **English 10**.

ALEKS MATH

***Geometry (Sem 1 or Sem 2)**

This course is designed for students who did not receive credit for either semester of Geometry.

ALEKS MATH (Continued)

***Pre-Algebra (Sem 1)**

***Pre-Algebra (Sem 2)**

The Pre Algebra courses are designed to build a strong foundation for Algebra as well as preparation for Geometry and an introduction to Probability. It will incorporate a wide variety of exercises that range from developing basic skills to introducing logical reasoning and problem solving. Other strategies that will lead to success in mathematics like note taking, reading mathematics, doing homework, and test-taking skills will be addressed in this course.

***Algebra (Sem 1)**

***Algebra (Sem 2)**

These courses cover basic topics in algebra including expressing relationships algebraically, solving equations/inequalities and graphing, polynomial operations and factoring, systems of equations, and rational and irrational numbers. Linear and quadratic equations are applied to problem solving.

SCIENCE

***Biology**

This course may be taken for either semester of biology make-up credit. Lecture, discussion and labs involving the following topics are included: cell biology, simple cell chemistry, genetics, classification, ecological relationships, biotic communities and resource conservation.

***Physical Science**

This course would be make-up credit for either semester of Integrated Science. The most current principles and concepts of physical science are presented. Through the use of observation, experimentation and scientific inquiry and reasoning, students are introduced to the physical laws that explain relationship between matter and energy.

GRADES 9-12

SOCIAL STUDIES

***American Government**

This course is offered for students seeking credit for 9th grade Government and Society. The course provides a historical background to the development of the Constitution and a detailed, in-depth study and analysis of the U. S. Constitution, with special emphasis on the branches of the U. S. Government. Special efforts are made to show students note taking and outlining skills, test study skills and techniques for writing essay test answers. This class serves as make-up credit for first semester or second semester of Government and Society.

***U.S. History**

This course covers the years from 1790 to present. This course serves as make-up credit for either semester of U.S. History.

***NovaNet**

NovaNet is a computer based credit recovery program. Admittance into the program is based upon administrative, guidance, and parent approval. Students will gain credits through computer instruction and real life application instruction. To enroll in this course, the student must be considered credit deficient.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Gymnastics – 11:35 to 12:30

Students will be taught many aspects of a gymnastics program. This instructional course is offered for students of any ability level.

***Health (Remedial)**

This course serves as **make-up credit** for 9th grade Health. As in the regular course, this course is designed to help students better understand the physical, social and emotional changes which are taking place during their adolescence. By increasing their understanding of themselves, students are more understanding of others. The curriculum for this course includes: personal health, human relations, safety and accident prevention, advancing medical knowledge, and looking ahead.

PARENTS: Please note that Skyward is NOT accessible to you during the course of summer school.

Freshman Health

Watertown High School is now offering Freshman Health in summer school. All students are required to earn .5 credit of Health in order to graduate. **Incoming freshmen** can earn .5 credit in advance of their freshman year in order to gain scheduling flexibility during their first year in high school. The summer course will follow the same curricular guidelines as Health taken during the regular school year that emphasizes physical, emotional and social well-being throughout life. Among the objectives covered will be: responsible decision-making, setting goals, social-emotional health, ATOD abuse and awareness, healthy relationships and conflict resolution. **In order to obtain .5 credit for this class, 100% Attendance is required.**

Freshman Health: June 19 – July 12

Class runs from 8:00am until 2:30pm, and is 15 days long.

Money 101

Watertown High School is now offering Money 101 during Summer School. All students are required to earn .5 credit in personal finance in order to graduate. The summer course will follow the same curricular guidelines as are used during the school year, emphasizing practical money management skills and financial planning. Incoming sophomores, juniors and seniors can take this class. **To obtain .5 credit in this class, 100% Attendance is required.**

Money 101: June 19 – July 12

Class runs from 8:00am until 2:30pm, and is 15 days long.
