

New Construction**Financing****Bond Campaigns**

While the Board may, and should, provide the public with information on school building needs, it may not use District funds to advocate "yes" votes on bond issues. While a unified school district has the authority by law to raise taxes for Board issues, the Board of Education recognizes the importance of a community referendum for the purpose of borrowing for construction purposes.

It is the policy of the Board to activate a Citizens Advisory Committee, if necessary, to examine building needs in advance of any building program so that the Committee may make its findings known both to the Board and to the public.

As the need for bond issue support arises, a Citizens Committee for Better Schools may be encouraged to form for the purpose of promoting the passage of the bond issue and collecting funds needed for such promotion.

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
